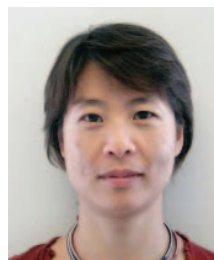

Inspired by Professor John CY Leong, she committed herself to Orthopaedic Surgery and completed her orthopaedic training at the Queen Mary Hospital. She obtained her fellowship from the Hong Kong College of Orthopaedics Surgeons and the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh in Orthopaedics in 2006. She was awarded the Authur Yau Award Paper in HKCOS 2002.

While working as a general Orthopaedic Surgeon in the government hospital, she recognized the urge to extend further effort in foot and ankle surgery. This is a relatively under-covered area with limited recognition and resources. She extended her sub-specialty training in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital as a devoted foot and ankle team member and later pursued overseas training with Professor Michael Stephen in Dublin, Ireland. During her overseas training, she worked with a wide spectrum of world renowned surgeons in Europe including Professor Michael Stephen in Dublin, Professor Beat Hintermann in Basel, and Professor Pascal Rippstein in Zurich.

Dr. Yeung commenced private practice in Orthopaedic Surgery in 2009 with a special interest in foot and ankle surgery. She is pleased to be recognized as a foot and ankle specialist among the orthopaedic practices in Hong Kong. She has always held a belief that only by concentrating on a narrow but in-depth knowledge in a sub specialized field that outstanding service can be provided. She currently serves as a visiting consultant for the Cirque Du Soleil in Macau and she is the designated foot and ankle surgeon with Cirque Du Soleil and House of Dancing Water in Macau. She has many years of experience with ballet dancers treating foot and ankle injuries for both local HK Ballet and Academy of Performance Arts in Hong Kong.

Outside her workplace, she keeps up her effort in developing foot and ankle surgery. She is currently appointed as a member of the Hong Kong Orthopaedic Association and the organizing committee of Hong Kong Orthopaedic Association Annual Congress 2011. She is also constantly delivering presentations and talks to local and regional meetings. She keeps a close relationship with the University of Hong Kong as a Honorary Clinical Assistant Professor in Orthopaedic Surgery, Queen Mary Hospital and is working as a teaching surgeon at the Hong Kong College of Orthopaedic Surgeons. Dr. Yeung had been involved in voluntary service for Médecins Sans Frontières service in Jordan in 2007 and missionary medical service in Henan, China in 2008. Professor Yongping Zheng received the BSc and MEng in Electronics and Information Engineering from the University of Science and Technology of China. He received the PhD degree in Biomedical Engineering from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (PolyU) in 1997. After a postdoctoral fellowship at the University of Windsor, Canada, he joined PolyU as an Assistant Professor in 2001 and was promoted to Associate Professor and Professor in 2005 and 2008, respectively, in the Department of Health Technology and Informatics. He also serves as the Associate Director of the Research Institute of Innovative Products in PolyU from 2008 to 2010. He is currently a member of PolyU Knowledge Transfer Committee.

Prof. Zheng's main research interests include biomedical ultrasound instrumentation, ultrasound elasticity measurement and imaging, 3D ultrasound imaging, ultrasound assessment for musculoskeletal tissues, and wearable sensors for healthcare. He has published over 100 SCI papers, and over 160 conference abstracts and proceeding papers. His research and development works have won many international awards. He has trained 6 Postdoctoral Fellows, 6 PhD (4 got Faculty Distinguished Thesis Award), 5 MPhil and 6 MSc graduates, and 4 PhD, 1 MPhil and 3 MSc students are currently under his supervision.
